Conexao Solidaria





Piorski.

- Designer info: Polish in name but Brazilian in colour and print, Piorski's autumn/winter 2010/11 collection looked playful and sweet.
- Key themes: A girlish mix of Japanese doll with 60s California.
- Colour palette: Muted shades were key soft sorbet tones, khaki, sky blue and taupe dominated.
- Fabric and detail: Ruffles and pleats, giant bows, pattern clashing and childlike motifs were tempered with cropped hems and sharp tailoring. WGSN loved the use of pastel checks.

Ronaldo Silvestre

- Designer info: Ronaldo Silvestre is the D-Squared of Brazil all layered denim, workwear references and urban styling.
- Key themes: A contrasting mix of 90s hip hop styling (drop-crotch denim) with 40s workwear and 50s nipped waists.
- Colour palette: A steely palette of charcoal, black and grey had light relief in the form of tan, washed khaki and vintage lemon.
- Fabric and detail: Textured layering was key for menswear sheepskin vests over cotton shirts, with
 a corduroy jacket thrown on top looked strong.

Conexao Solidaria

- Designer info: Conexao Solidaria is a charitable organisation promoting traditional craftsmanship, often by impoverished communities. Dragao Fashion Week marked the catwalk debut of its designer collaboration.
- Key themes: A short but succinct collection of embroidered, crocheted and knitted pieces, with voluminous proportions.
- Colour palette: Pale neutrals and sandy tones formed the base, with occasional pops of rich tropical
 colours or graphic black.
- Fabric and detail: Traditional Brazilian crocheting alongside washed linens, silks, cottons and draped jersey.

Gustavo Silvestre

- Designer info: Brazilian Gustavo Silvestre is renowned for his bold use of embroidery, which looked particularly strong this season.
- . Key themes: A layered, tribal theme was tempered by slick silhouettes and washed denim.
- . Colour palette: Bursts of orange and turquoise against taupe, navy and black.
- Fabric and detail: Volume was reined in with cropped hem lengths and belted waists. Richly textured jumper dresses and coats were a WGSN favourite.

- Designer info: Joao Pimenta takes a bold approach to menswear, playing with traditional concepts of colour, tailoring and proportion.
- Key themes: The autumn/winter 2010/11 collection was stripped back to three key colours with minimal detailing. Think traditional monk's robes mixed with nomadic-style layering.
- Colour palette: A directional mix of tonal camel, burnt peach and rich honey.
- Fabric and detail: Materials included suede, leather, canvas and draped jersey. Shirts and coats
 were elongated, while soft fluting, gathering and cape silhouettes added softness.

Lino Villaventura

- Designer info: Local designer Lino Villaventura closed Dragao Fashion Week with characteristic drama. Brazilian supermodels, the odd local celebrity and a packed auditorium added a frisson of excitement.
- Key themes: Villaventura's core customer is an older, moneyed Brazilian lady pieces were grand
 and expertly tailored. There was more than a hint of 80s Issey Miyake in the angular proportions and
 use of treated fabrics.
- Colour palette: A rich winter palette of black, auburn, red and mahogany.
- Fabric and detail: The focus was on the shoulder and arms fabric was draped, layered and asymmetrical for dramatic volume.

- Designer info: Madame Surto offers women's, youth and kidswear, all with its signature use of bold colour and playful detailing.
- Key themes: The collection's loose shapes, soft tailoring and breezy colours are perfect for winter holiday breaks. The occasional Victorian blouse or black draped smartened the look.
- . Colour palette: Splashes of red, lime green and royal blue were set against a base of white and tan.
- Fabric and detail: Sheer fabrications were layered for texture, while tailoring had a soft quality.

- Designer info: Brazilian designer Melk Z-da continually impresses with his spiky, industrial creations in lurid neon tones.
- Key themes: Adaptability and personalisation was key for autumn/winter 2010/11. Coats
 transformed into capes, dresses were reversible and voluminous detail could be taken on or off with
 press studs.
- . Colour palette: Sandy neutrals with highlights of neon orange and sky blue.
- Fabric and detail: A slight tribal element was creeping in for winter in print and embroidery. Exposed
 corseting added structure to cropped minidresses.



Industrial futurism



- · A mix of 80s rock and dystopian future references think Blade Runner or Demolition Man
- · An industrial palette is key, paired with metallic studding
- · Key fabrications include Lycra, jersey and treated denim

Moroccan nomad



- · Contrasting with the rock vibe is an ethnic, nomadic theme
- · Focus on earthy colours with a sunburnt quality
- Draped layering and voluminous proportions

Military greens



- · Referencing the overarching earthy vibe this season, but with an industrial twist
- · Hues range from faded lime to deep khaki
- · Looks strong on more feminine pieces

Burnt orange



- · Colour of choice at Dragao Fashion Week
- · Hues are deep, rich and striking
- · All-over tonal variations look the strongest

Sandy neutrals



- · Key for the cooler months, continuing on from summer
- · Warmer undertones and subtle tonal qualities
- Play with the juxtaposition of a soft colour in a hard fabric

Micro shorts



- · Another carry-over from summer
- · Either rocker vibe or abstract tailoring
- · Keep colours striking either black, white or acid-washed denim

Relaxed summer tailoring



- · Soft white and neutral tones
- · Cocooning shapes and voluminous proportions
- · Keep fabrics natural and breezy untreated linen, cotton/canvas and silk
